At a Court of Quarterly Session held for the County of Weythe at the Court house on the 11<sup>th</sup> of March 1817

Thom as Warner one of the executors of Joseph Barron dec<sup>d</sup> produced in Court a Copy of the will of of said Barron which being duly authenticated from the County of Sumner & State of Tennessee It is ordered that the same be recorded and that probate thereof be granted to said Warner whereupon he entered into bond with William Hay and Joseph Crockett his securities in the Penalty of \$30,000 conditioned as the Law directs, and took the oath required by Law. teste

In the Name of God, Amen.

I Peter Moyer of the County of Weythe, and Commonwealth of Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing memory, think proper to make my last will & Testament, in manner following to wit.

I desire that after my decease my personal property may be sold, and my Just debts paid out of it, and the balance after payment of the Legacies herein after directed to be paid out of the same, to be divided equally amongst all my children.

Item. I give and bequeath to my two sons Peter and John the tract of Land I purchased of Peter Kettering containing about two Hundred acres, my son Peter to have the upper end of said tract including the old improvement and the tract to be equally divided as to Quantity without regard to quality. I also give and bequeath to my said two sons Peter and John, an other tract of Land, adjoining the former and being the same I purchased of Nicholas Blinn, containing upwards of one hundred and sixty acres, to be equally divided between my said sons Peter and John according to quantity, without regard to quality - they paying such legacies as herein after directed to be paid by them which Land I give and bequeath to my said son Peter and John to be enjoyed by them for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my two sons Michael and Henry the tract of Land on which I at present reside lying on the south fork of Red Bank, being two hundred and containing in the whole about two hundred and eighty acres to be equally divided between my said two sons Michael & Henry according to quantity, without regard to quality, and to be enjoyed by them forever, they paying such legacies as are herein after directed to be paid by them.

Peter Moyer's Will

I give and bequeath to my said son Michael a good saddle horse out of my personal Estate

I give and bequeath to my said son Henry a good saddle horse, saddle and bridle, out of my personal Estate.

Item. I give and bequeath to my six Daughters, namely, Milly the wife of Thomas Kegley, Barbara the wife of Martin Weyrick, Peggy, Catharine, Leah, and Sarah, One hundred & fifteen dollars & four shillings each to be paid to them by my four sons Peter, John, Michael & Henry in the following manner to wit Two hundred dollars to be paid by son Peter, Two hundred dollars to be paid by my son John, Two hundred dollars, to be paid by my son Michael, and One hundred Dollars to be paid by my son Henry the whole to be paid within two years after my decease; except that part to be paid by my son Henry, which is not to be paid by him untill he attains the age of twenty one year should he not attain that age within two years after my decease. One half of the said sums to be paid my Daughters as aforesaid shall be paid to them in Cash the other half in good Property.

Item. I give and bequeath to my four Daughters Peggy, Catharine, Leah, and Sarah, two good cows and one feather Bed and furniture, to each of them, to be paid out of my personal Estate.

Item. It is my will and desire that my four sons Peter, John, Michael, & Henry shall give and furnish to my beloved wife Catharine a good decent and comfortable maintenance and support during her life.

Item. It has been my intention that my three sons Peter, John & Michael should pay to me during my life, the sum of One hundred Dollars, each an equal part in consideration of my bequeathing to them the Land before mentioned, now is my will and desire, that should the aforesaid sum of one hundred dollars not be demanded of my said sons Peter, John & Michael, and paid by them during my life, that the same shall equally divided between all my children the said Peter, John & Michael retaining for themselves an equal share with the rest.

Lastly. I constitute and appoint my friend Joseph Crockett Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other or former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made. - In testime my self I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this day of in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fourteen (1814) signed, sealed, published, and declared by the Testator as and for his last will and testament in our presence who have signed our names as Witnesses thereto in his presence and at his request

This the last will and testament of Peter Moyer dec<sup>d</sup> was produced in Court & being proved by the oaths of Christopher Brown & John L. Lundenberger two of the subscribing witnesses thereto the same is ordered to be recorded. And Joseph Crockett the Executor named in said will having refused to take upon himself the burden of the Execution thereof & relinquishes all his right as Executor under the same; and Catherine Moyer Widow of the said Peter, having also relinquished her right to the administration of the said Estate of Peter Moyer dec<sup>d</sup> on the Motion of Peter Moyer & Michael Moyer Letters of administration with the will annexed is granted them of said Estate, whereupon the entered into Court with Leonard Shaw jr & Valer Johnston their securities in the penalty of two thousand Dollars conditioned as the Law directs took the oath required by Law

In the name of God Amen. I William Shipp of the County of Weymouth and Commonwealth of Virginia being sick & weak in body, but of sound and disposing Mind, Memory, and understanding, considering the uncertainty of, death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby to the better prepared to leave this world, when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following - That is to say

1st. - and principally, I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to the Earth, to be decently Buried, at the discretion of my Executors, and after my debts and Funeral charges are paid I devise and Bequeath as follows.

2nd. I give and bequeath unto my daughter, One Bird to bow, with a white face to be at her disposal, immediately after my decease, and One Bird to bow, with feathers a quantity of Cotton yarn she her self has spun, and all and every part of her cloths or clothing, she may think proper to claim, and also the sum of two hundred Dollars Lawfull Money of Virginia to be paid unto the said my daughter, by my Executors herein after to be named, or to her Order or assign, so soon as they shall have collected that amount out of the proceeds of my Estate, in consideration of the care and trouble in attending, on me during my illness and heretofore.

3rd. I give and Bequeath unto my daughter, Catherine Miller, and to the other mentioned my daughter, all of my pewter ware or Furniture of any kind, whatsoever, to be equally divided among, or between, them, immediately after my decease, by my Executors.

4th. I give and bequeath unto my son in Law Adam Miller, One Brown Mare, which he is to consider as his own property, and to take possession of the said Mare
